1. Income Taxes

The Company's effective Federal Income tax rate is 0% as a result of its Federal Income tax exemption under I.R.C. 501(c)(6).

As a tax-exempt organization, the Company is subject to income tax on activities that generate net income unrelated to its tax-exempt purpose of providing primary share insurance to its members. At September 30, 2002, the Company has unrelated business income tax ("UBIT") loss carryforwards of approximately \$2,245,000 that are available to offset future unrelated business income. The UBIT loss carryforwards expire as follows: 2008 - \$99,000; 2009 - \$309,000; 2010 - \$281,000; 2011 - \$172,000; 2012 - \$33,000; 2018 - \$323,000; 2019 - \$402,000; 2020 - \$394,000; and 2021 - \$232,000.

Total income taxes of approximately \$2,445 and \$5,293 were paid during 2002 and 2001, respectively, and represent Federal excise taxes due on political contributions.


