Reserves as of December 31, 2010 were \$461,000. As of June 30, 2011, \$195,000 has been paid for incurred losses and loss adjustment expenses attributable to insured events of prior years. Reserves remaining for prior years are now \$266,000 as a result of re-estimation of unpaid claims and claim adjustment expenses principally on Private Passenger Auto and Commercial Auto lines of insurance. As a result, there has been no prior year development during the six months ended June 30, 2011 as compared to a \$37,000 favorable development during the six months ended June 30, 2010. The change is generally the result of ongoing analysis of recent loss development trends. Original estimates are increased or decreased as additional information becomes known regarding individual claims. See table below for the effect resulting from the inclusion of extra-contractual obligations.
