**1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:**

**A. Accounting Practices:**

The accompanying financial statements of State Auto Insurance Company of Ohio (the "Company" or "SA Ohio") are presented on the basis of accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance, which has adopted the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) *Accounting Practices and Procedures* manual (NAIC SAP).

The prepayment model uses a number of factors to estimate prepayment activity including the time of year (seasonality), current levels of interest rates (refinancing incentive), economic activity (including housing turnover) and term and age of the underlying collateral (burnout, seasoning).


