1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies-

A. Accounting Practices

The financial statements of American Select Insurance Company (the Company) are presented on the basis of accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

The Ohio Department of Insurance recognizes only statutory accounting practices (SAP) prescribed or permitted by the State of Ohio for determining and reporting the financial condition and results of operations of an insurance company, for determining its solvency under the Ohio Insurance law. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) *Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual* (NAIC SAP) has been adopted as a component of prescribed or permitted practices by the State of Ohio.

The Company has not implemented any prescribed or permitted accounting practices by the State of Ohio that differ from those found in NAIC SAP.

On January 1, 2013, OFIC adopted SSAP No. 92R, *Accounting for Postretirement Benefits Other Than Pensions - A Replacement of SSAP No. 14 and SSAP No. 102, Accounting for Pensions - A Replacement of SSAP No. 89*. The standards require insurers to recognize the overfunded or underfunded status of a defined benefit postretirement plan as an asset or liability and include non-vested employees in determining the plan obligations. 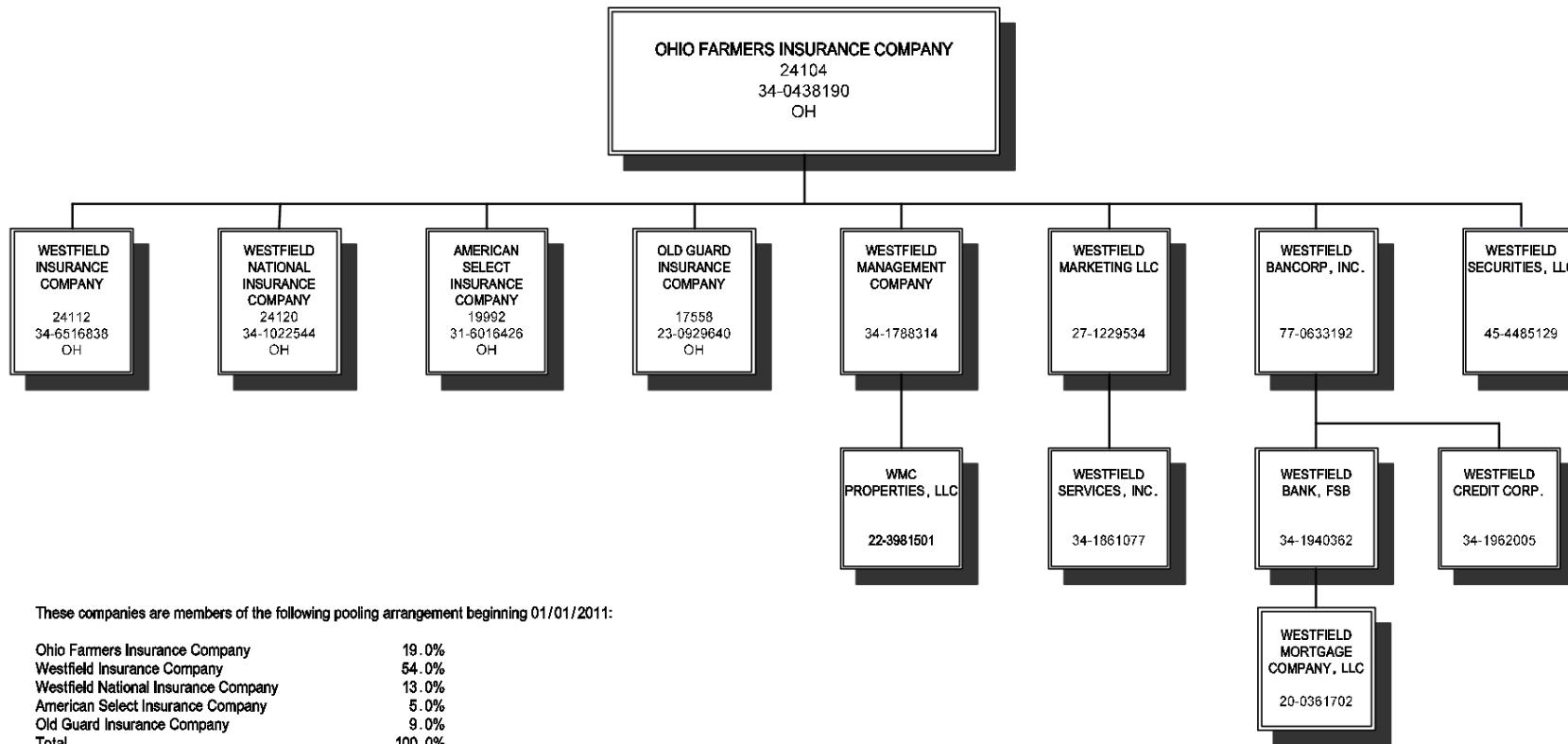
