The financial statements of Lightning Rod Mutual Insurance Company (LRMIC) are presented on the basis of accounting principles prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

The Ohio Department of Insurance recognizes only statutory accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the State of Ohio for determining and reporting the financial condition and results of operations of an insurance company for determining its solvency under Ohio Insurance Law. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) *Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual* (NAIC SAP) has been adopted as a component of prescribed or permitted practices by the State of Ohio.

Effective January 1, 2013 the Company adopted the provisions of SSAP No. 102, *Accounting for Pensions, A Replacement of SSAP No. 89*. As a result, the Company recorded an adjustment to unassigned funds (surplus) net of deferred tax of \$87,587.

Reserves remaining for prior years are now \$27.2 million as a result of re-estimation of unpaid claims and claim adjustment expenses for commercial auto liability, auto physical damage, homeowners/farmowners, commercial multi-peril, other liability and special property lines of insurance. These decreases were offset, in part, by increases in workers' compensation and private passenger auto liability lines of insurance. Therefore, there has been a \$1.1 million favorable prior-year development from December 31, 2012 to March 31, 2013. The decrease is generally the result of ongoing analysis of recent loss development trends. 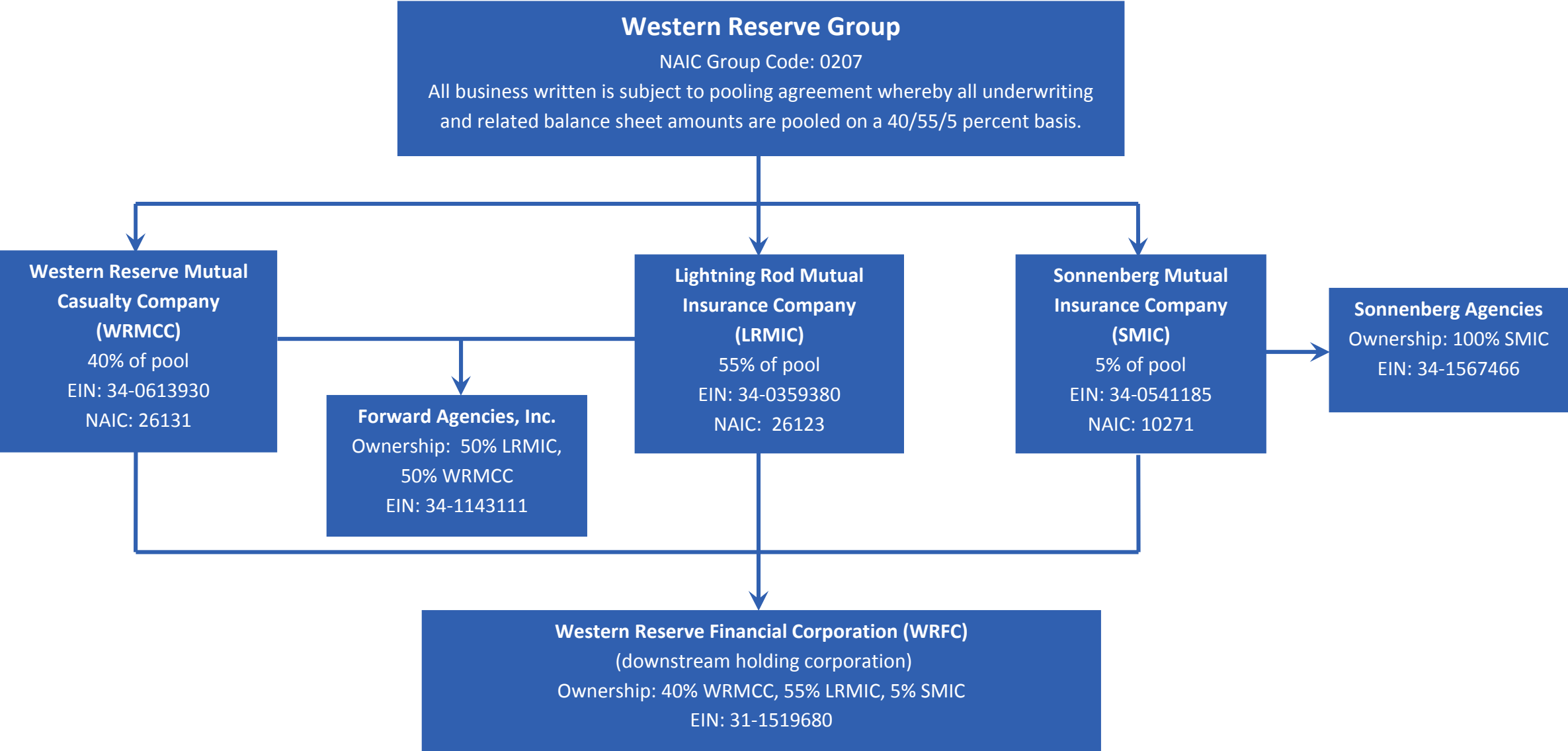
