1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A. Accounting Practices

The financial statements of Lightning Rod Mutual Insurance Company (LRMIC) are presented on the basis of accounting principles prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

The Ohio Department of Insurance recognizes only statutory accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the State of Ohio for determining and reporting the financial condition and results of operations of an insurance company for determining its solvency under Ohio Insurance Law. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) *Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual* (NAIC SAP) has been adopted as a component of prescribed or permitted practices by the State of Ohio.

2. Accounting Changes and Corrections of Errors

Accounting changes adopted to conform to the provisions of the NAIC Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual are reported as changes in accounting principles. The cumulative effect of the changes in accounting principles is reported as an adjustment to unassigned funds (surplus) in the period of the change in accounting principle. The cumulative effect is the difference between the amount of capital and surplus at the beginning of the year and the amount of capital and surplus that would have been reported at that date if the new accounting principles had been applied retroactively for all periods.

Effective January 1, 2013 the Company adopted the provisions of SSAP No. 102, *Accounting for Pensions, A Replacement of SSAP No. 89*. As a result, the Company recorded an adjustment to unassigned funds (surplus) net of deferred tax (\$45,121) of \$87,587.

Effective July 1, 2013, the Company changed its method of depreciation from Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery System (MACRS) to straight-line as the Company believes the straight-line method would more appropriately allocate the cost over the useful life. This change in accounting principle was recorded as a surplus adjustment in accordance with SSAP No. 3 *Accounting Changes and Errors*. The change did not have a material effect on the financial condition of the Company.

Effective July 1, 2013, the Company also recorded a surplus adjustment in accordance with SSAP No. 3 *Accounting Changes and Errors* to correct the book values of assets that should have been fully depreciated. The change did not have a material effect on the financial condition of the Company.

Reserves as of December 31, 2012 were \$35.9 million. In calendar year 2013, \$14.5 million has been paid for incurred losses and loss adjustment expenses attributable to insured events of prior years. Reserves remaining for prior years are now \$19.2 million. Therefore, there has been a \$2.1 million favorable prior-year development from December 31, 2012 to September 30, 2013. The favorable development is generally the result of ongoing analysis of recent loss development trends and from decreases in the estimates of loss and loss adjustment expenses for the following lines of business: commercial auto liability, auto physical damage, homeowners/farmowners, commercial multi-peril, other liability and special property. These decreases were offset, in part, by increases in workers comp and private passenger auto liability. Original estimates are increased or decreased as additional information becomes known regarding individual claims. 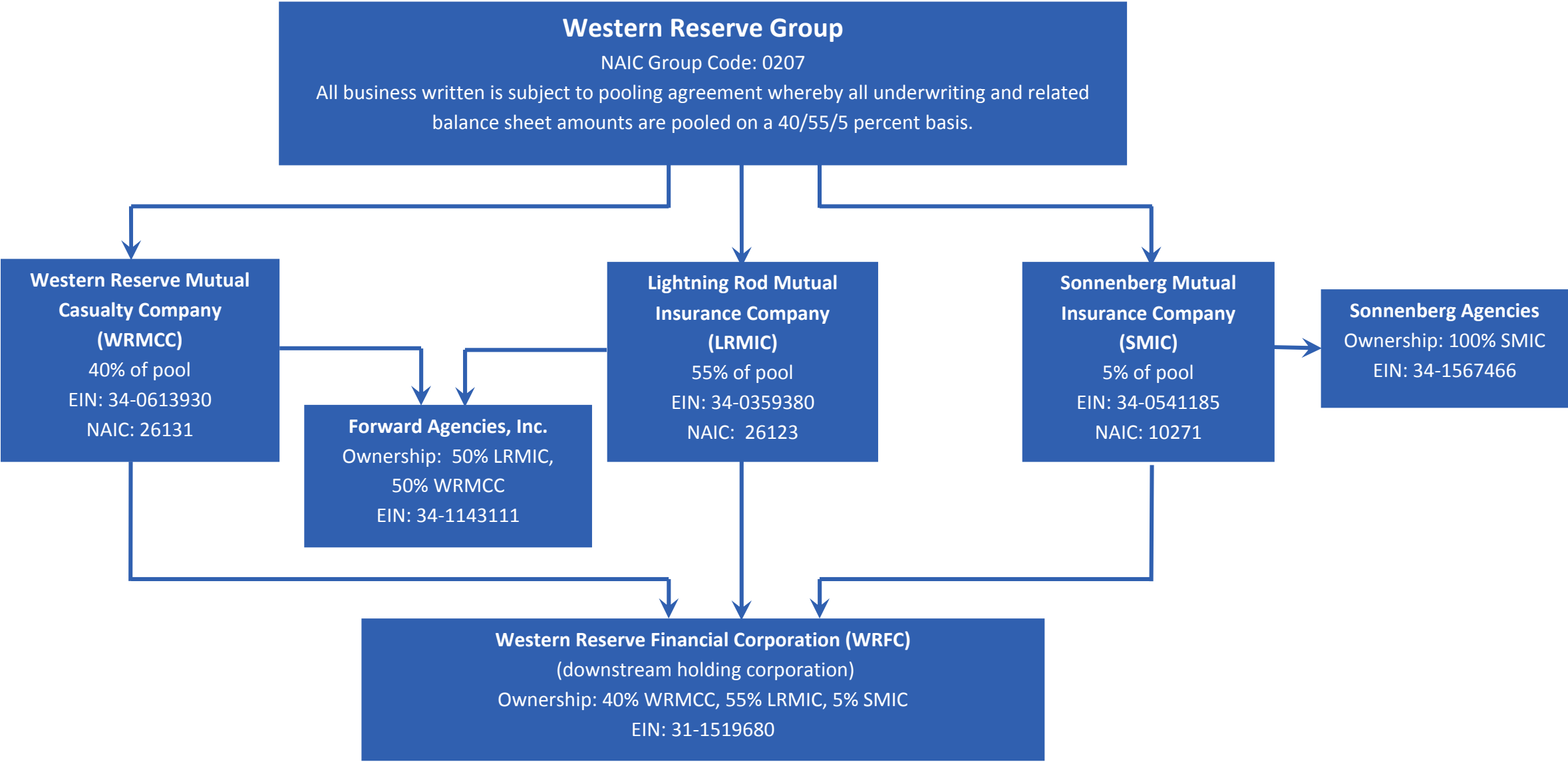
