NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

General Notes

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies and Going Concern-

A. Accounting Practices

The financial statements of Westfield National Insurance Company (the Company) are presented on the basis of accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

The Ohio Department of Insurance recognizes only statutory accounting practices (SAP) prescribed or permitted by the State of Ohio for determining and reporting the financial condition and results of operations of an insurance company, for determining its solvency under the Ohio Insurance law. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) *Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual* (NAIC SAP) has been adopted as a component of prescribed or permitted practices by the State of Ohio.

The Company has not implemented any prescribed or permitted accounting practices by the State of Ohio that differ from those found in NAIC SAP.

C. Accounting Policy

Premiums are earned over the terms of the related insurance policies and reinsurance contracts. Unearned premium reserves are established to cover the unexpired portion of premiums written. Such reserves are computed by pro rata methods for direct business and are based on reports received from ceding companies for reinsurance.

Expenses incurred in connection with acquiring new insurance business, including such acquisition costs as sales commissions, are charged to operations as incurred. Expenses incurred are reduced for ceding allowances received or receivable.

In addition, the Company uses the following accounting policies:

- (6) Loan backed securities are stated at either amortized cost or the lower of amortized cost or fair market value. The retrospective adjustment method is used to value all securities. If a security has been written down due to an other-than-temporary impairment, the prospective adjustment method is used subsequent to the loss recognition in accordance with SSAP No.43R.

D. Loan-Backed Securities

- (1) Prepayment assumptions for single class and multi class mortgage-backed/asset-backed securities were obtained from broker dealer survey values or internal estimates. The Company used Interactive Data Corp. in determining the market value of its loan-backed securities.
- (2-3) No other-than-temporary impairments have been recognized on loan-backed securities.
- (4) Impaired loan-backed securities for which an other-than-temporary impairment has not been recognized as of September 30, 2016 are summarized below:

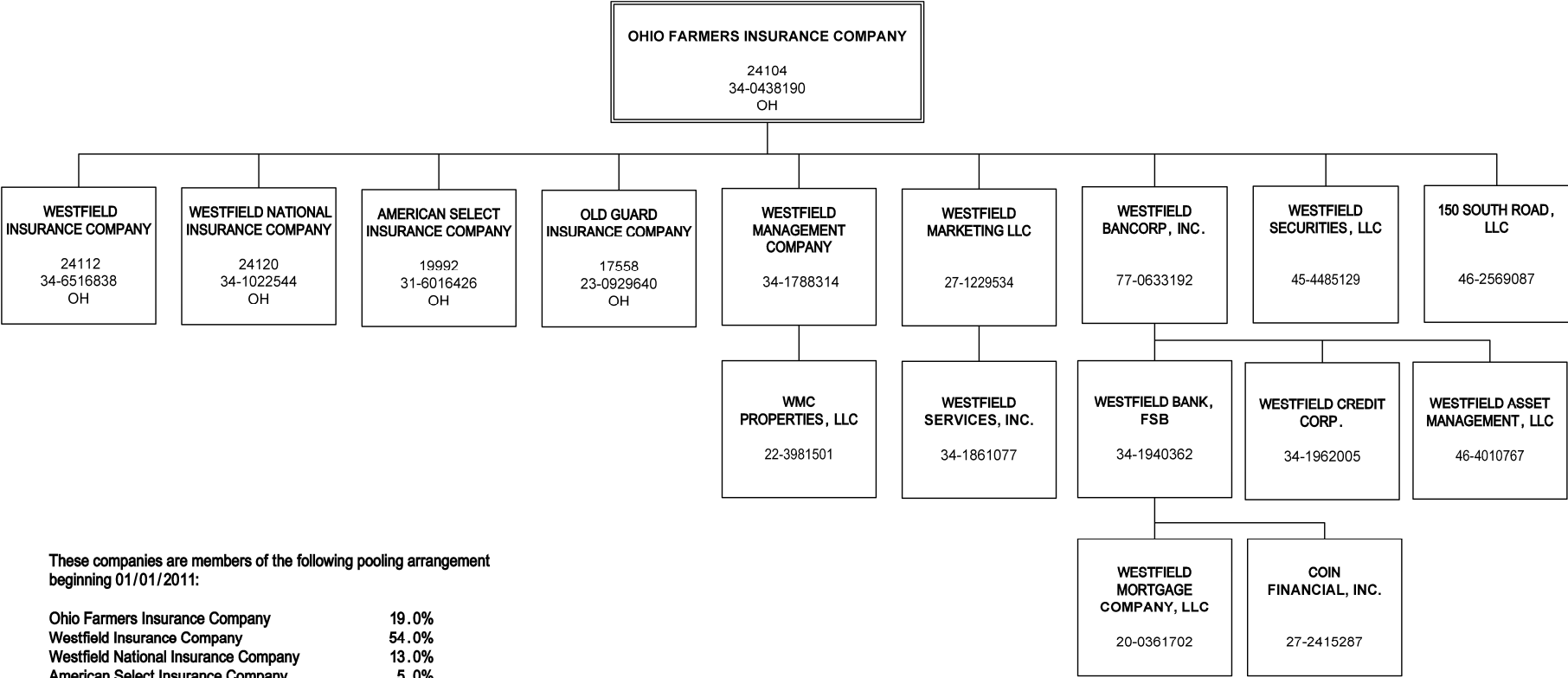
