Grange Insurance Company of Michigan (the “Company”) prepares its statutory financial statements in conformity with accounting practices prescribed or permitted by The Ohio Department of Insurance (the “Department”). In accordance with Bulletin 2022-06-INS from the State of Michigan Department of Insurance and Financial Services, the Company received a refund of surplus from the Michigan Catastrophic Claims Association as a member insurance company to pass through to its Michigan policyholders as of October 31, 2021. After receiving the refund, the Company is required to refund the policyholders as expeditiously as possible, but no later than 60 days after the receipt of the refund (no later than May 9, 2022. The Company has accounted for the refund as a \$2.8 million miscellaneous asset and liability (Line 25 on Page 2 and 3, respectively) for payments to be made in the second quarter of 2022 and both the asset and liability will be extinguished before the end of that quarter.

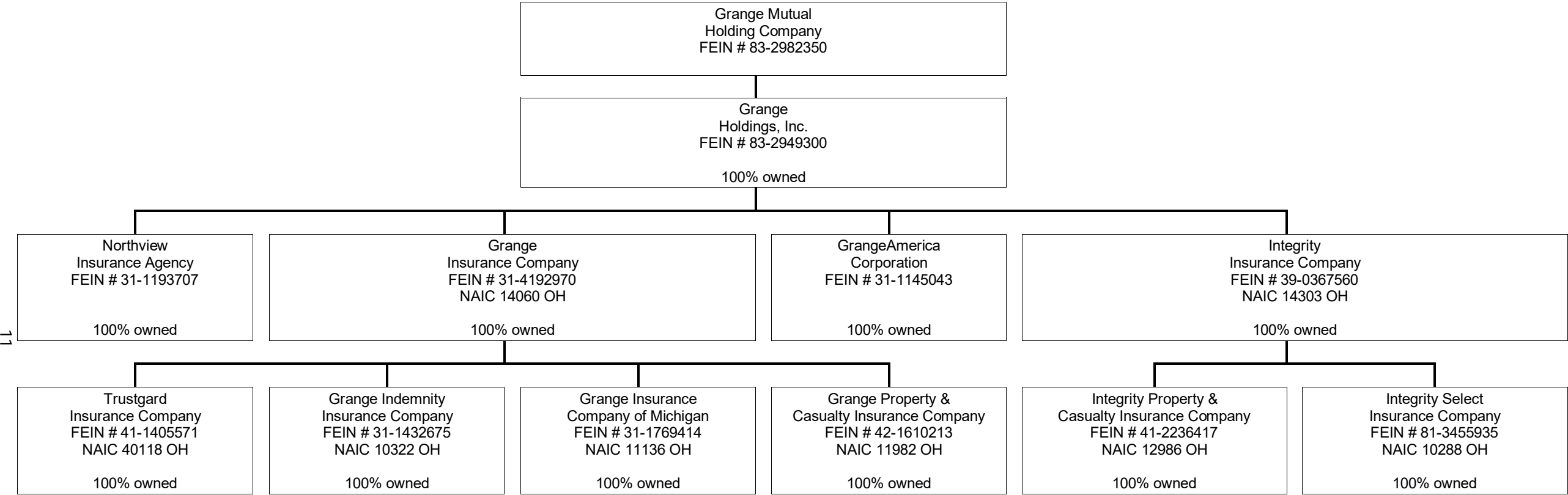
