CoSECTION A

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Accounting Practices

The accompanying financial statements of AultCare Health Insuring Company are presented on the basis of accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

The Ohio Department of Insurance recognizes only statutory accounting prescribed or permitted by the State of Ohio for determining and reporting the financial condition and results of operations of an insurance company, for determining its solvency under the Ohio Insurance Law. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners’ (NAIC) Accounting Practices and Procedures manual, (NAIC SAP) has been adopted as a component of prescribed or permitted practices by the state of Ohio.

The Company paid AultCare Corporation \$8,736,556 and \$9,608,057 respectively, for services provided under the Management and Administrative Services Agreement as of June 30, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

D. The Company has an intercompany revolving credit facility in place with AultCare Insurance Company, a subsidiary. The Company is owed \$ 2,115,792 and \$1,615,753 as of June 30, 2022 and June 30, 2021, respectively.

The Company has an intercompany revolving credit facility in place with AultCare Corporation, an affiliate that allows AultCare to borrow and repay operating funds. AultCare Corporation is owed \$0 as of June 30, 2022 and was owed \$5,187,478 as of June 30, 2021, respectively under the terms of the agreement.

The Company also has a capitation arrangement with Aultman Hospital for anticipation of future services. As of June 30, 2022, the Company has paid Aultman Hospital \$4,542,617 for these future services.

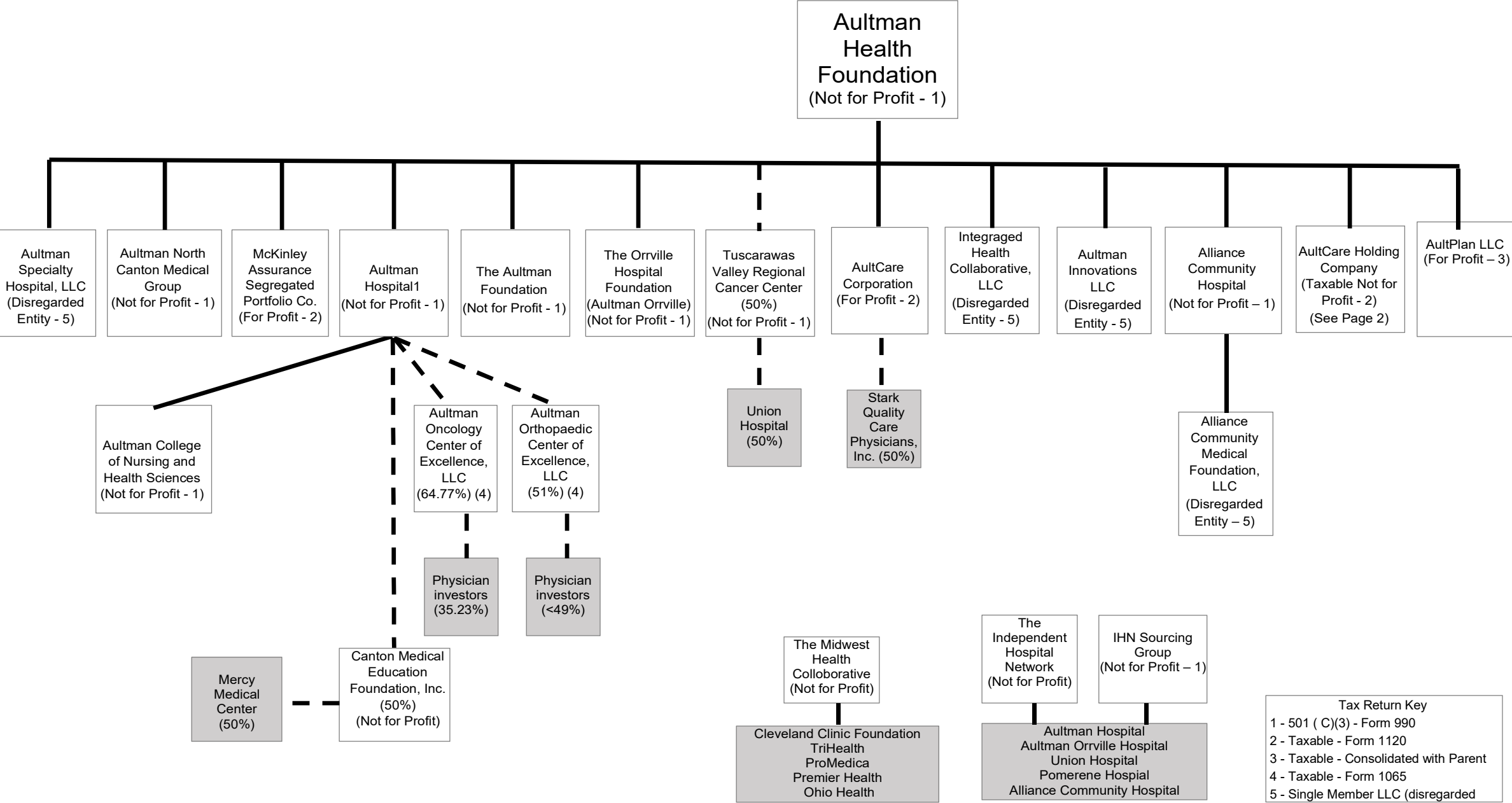

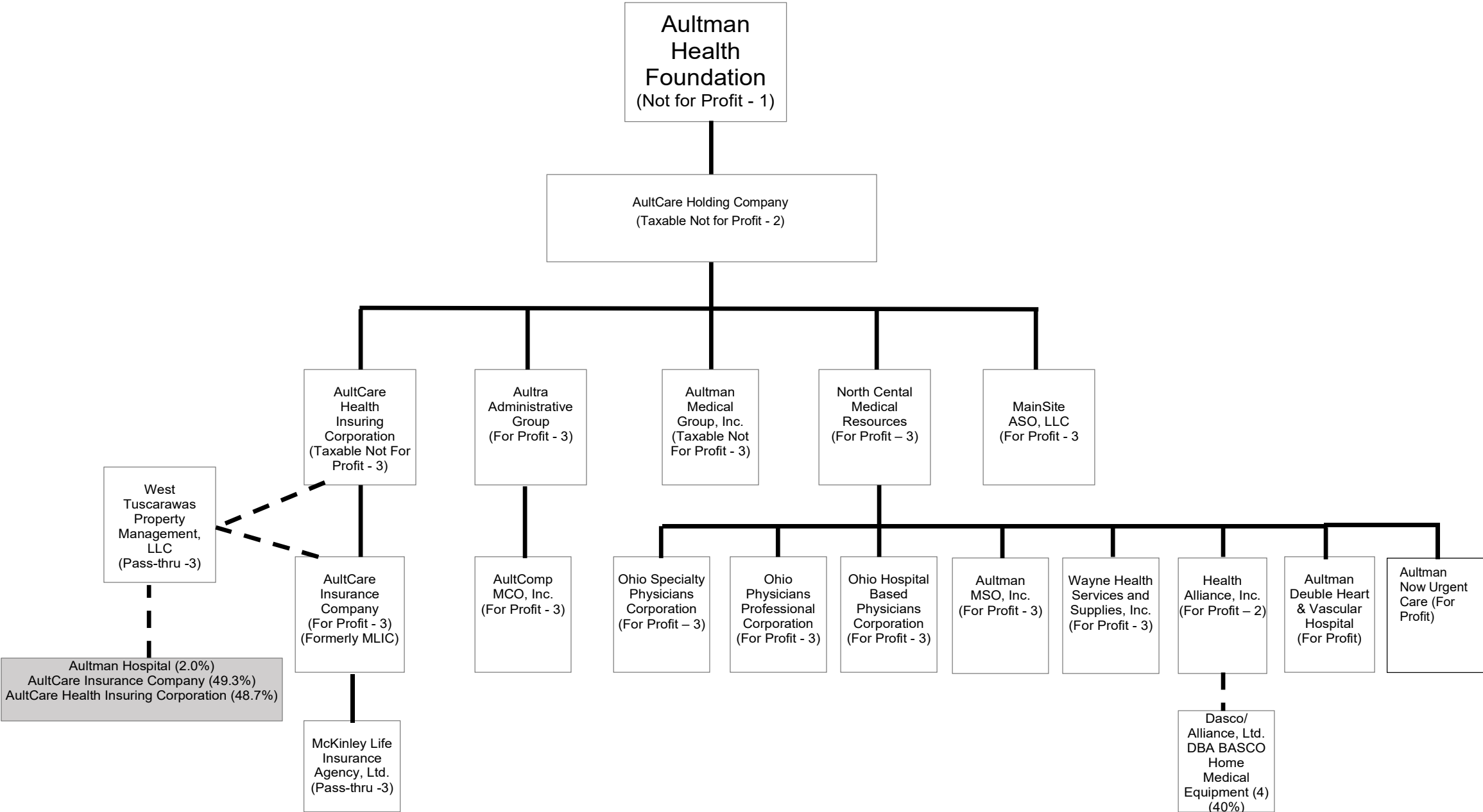
