NOTE 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies and Going Concern

A. Accounting Practices

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with statutory accounting principles (SAP) prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance (ODI). The ODI requires that insurance companies domiciled in the state prepare their financial statements in accordance with the National Association of Insurance Commissioners' (NAIC) Accounting Practices and Procedures Manual, subject to deviations prescribed by the ODI. The Company had no permitted practices for the period ended June 30, 2022.

Life premiums and annuity considerations are recorded as earned when received, adjusted for advance premiums and premiums deferred and uncollected. Reinsurance commission and expense allowances are recognized as revenue when realized in accordance with the contract terms.

Commissions and other acquisition costs are charged to operations as incurred instead of being deferred and amortized against the related policy premiums which are taken into income over the period covered by the policies.

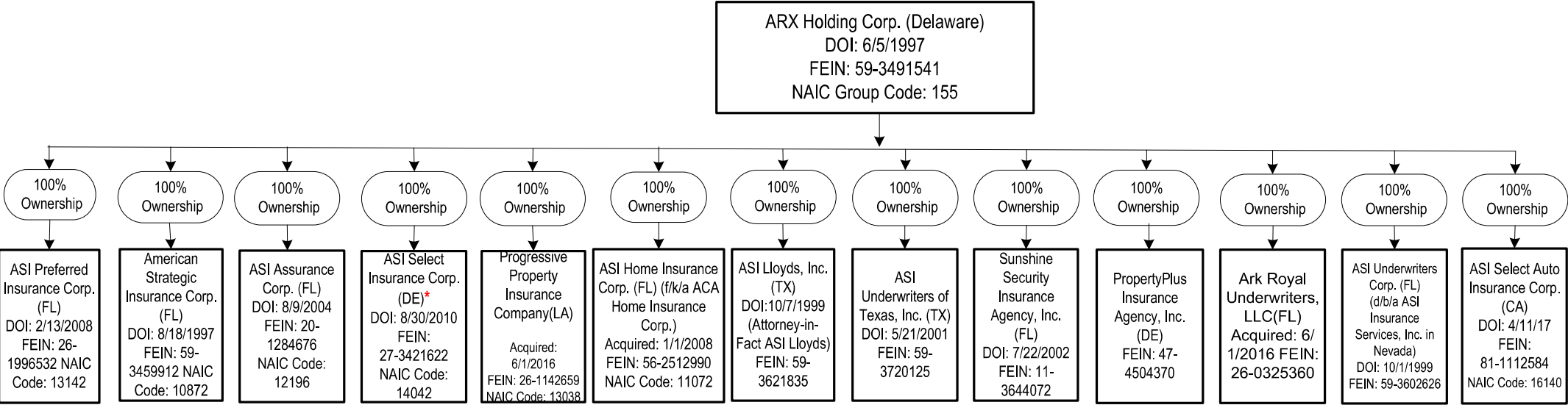

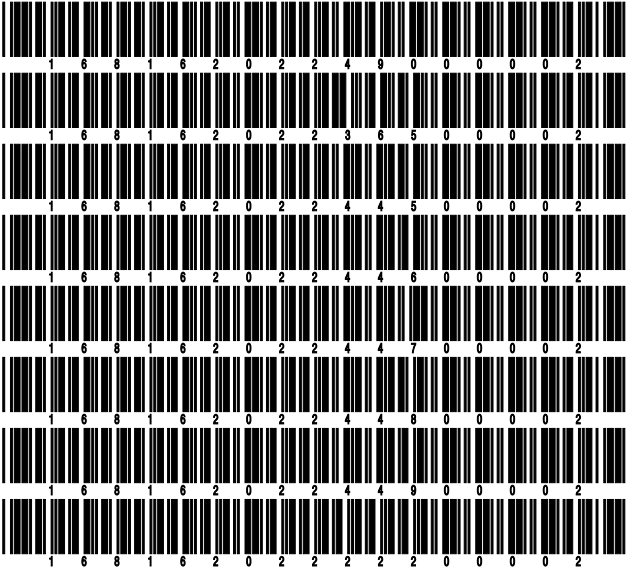
