The liability for claims unpaid and aggregate health claim reserves, net of reinsurance recoverables as of December 31, 2021, was (\$1,542,933). As of September 30, 2022, (\$1,782,960) has been recovered for incurred claims attributable to insured events of prior years. Reserves remaining for prior years, net of reinsurance recoverables are now \$215,840, as a result of re-estimation of unpaid claims. Therefore, there has been \$24,187 favorable prior year development since December 31, 2021, to September 30, 2022. The primary drivers consist of favorable development of \$602,908 in direct claims retroactivity for inpatient, outpatient, physician, and pharmacy claims and \$93,390 as a result of a net change in the provision for adverse deviations in experience partially offset by an unfavorable development of \$669,222 related to reinsurance activities (changes in reinsurance accruals on paid and unpaid claims net of reinsurance recoveries received). At December 31, 2021, the Trust recorded \$32,212 of unfavorable development related to prior years. The primary drivers consist of \$649,429 of unfavorable development in direct claims retroactivity for inpatient, outpatient, physician, and pharmacy, partially offset by favorable development of \$583,623 related to reinsurance activities (reinsurance recoveries received net changes in reinsurance accruals on paid and unpaid claims) and \$32,636 as a result of change in the provision for adverse deviations in experience.

The Trust incurred claims adjustment expenses (“CAE”) of \$150,410 and \$231,942 for the nine months ended September 30, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, respectively. These costs are included in the administrative fees paid by the Trust to United HealthCare Services, Inc (“UHS”) in exchange for administrative services performed by UHS for the Trust as outlined in the contract.
