The Company also is a party to a Management and Administrative Services Agreement with AultCare Corporation under which AultCare Corporation provides the Company with certain specified services, including (among others) management and administrative services, provider networking services, marketing and sales services, and office facilities. The Company paid AultCare Corporation \$14,422,288 and \$17,626,585, respectively, for services provided under the Management and Administrative Services Agreement as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively.

D. The Company has an intercompany revolving credit facility in place with AultCare Insurance Company, a subsidiary. The Company is owed \$49,616 and \$134,670 as of December 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022, respectively.

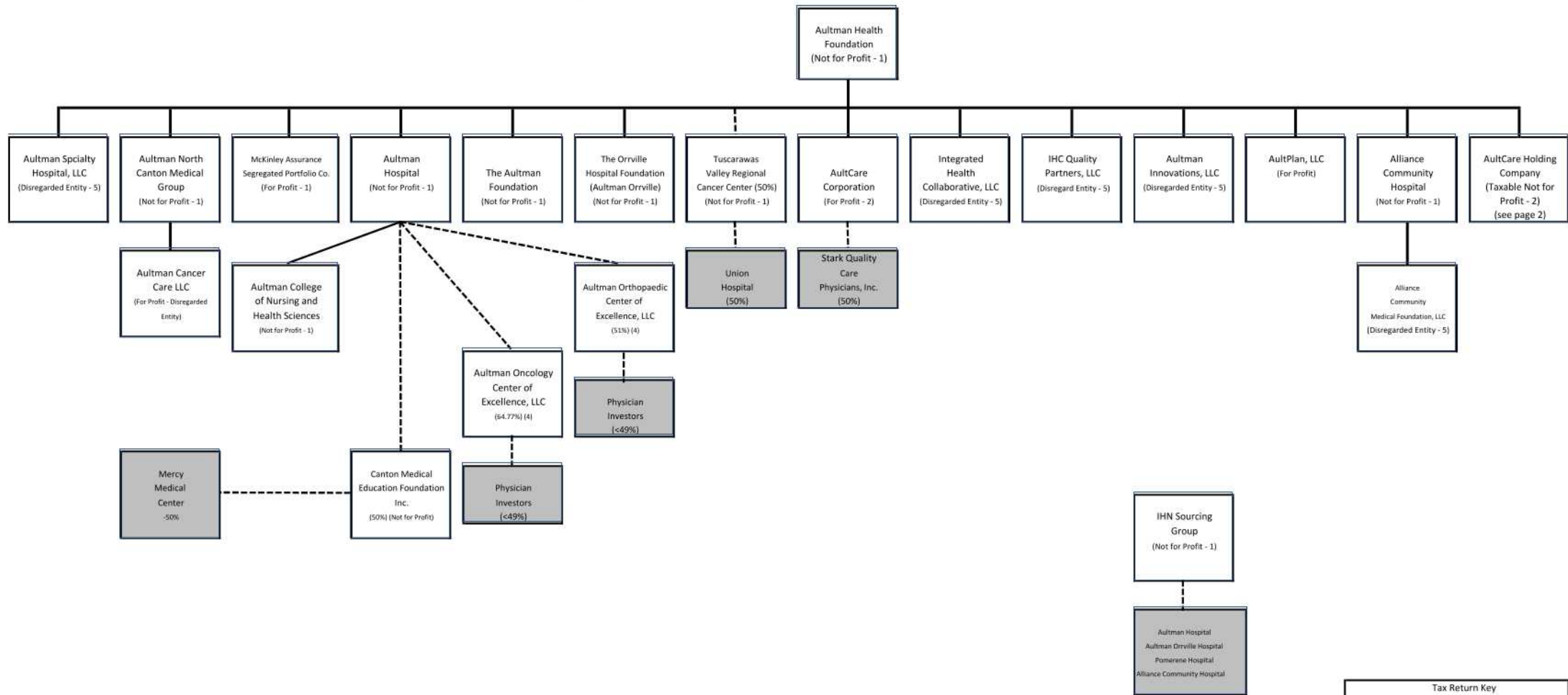
