

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NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies and Going Concern
A. Accounting Practices

The financial statements of Transport Insurance Company ("the Company") are presented on the basis of accounting practices prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

On October 14 2021, the Ohio Department of Insurance (ODI) granted a permitted practice allowing the Company to discount Loss and LAE (excluding A&O/ULAE) reserves on a non-tabular basis at a rate of 3% on the Workers' Compensation line of business only to continue until the Department instructs otherwise. On February 8, 2022, the ODI granted a permitted practice allowing the Company to discount Loss and LAE (excluding A&O/ULAE) reserves on a non-tabular basis at a rate of 3% on all lines of business, other than Workers' Compensation to continue until December 31, 2022. The second amendment was signed on June 28, 2022 to extend this discount to December 31, 2022. The change to full discounting was implemented during the 4th quarter 2021. On January 7, 2023 a third amendment was approved by the ODI and granted a permitted practice allowing the Company to discount Loss and LAE (excluding A&O/ULAE) reserves on a non-tabular basis at a rate of 4.25% on all lines of business until November 30, 2023. On December 15, 2023 a third amendment was approved by the ODI and granted a permitted practice allowing the Company to discount Loss and LAE (excluding A&O/ULAE) reserves on a non-tabular basis at a rate of 4.25% on all lines of business until November 30, 2024. The Department rescinded the permitted practice for discounting effective for the June 30, 2024 reserves.

The methods for making such estimates and for establishing the resulting liability are continually reviewed and any adjustments are reflected in the period determined.

D. Going Concern

As described in greater detail in Note 22 Events Subsequent, the Company no longer has a permitted practice from the Ohio Department of Insurance to discount its reserves. In the second quarter, a reserve review was completed, which resulted in the Company increasing loss and lae reserves by \$9.9 million. The reserving action, combined with the reversal of the permitted practice to discount loss and lae reserves, caused surplus to be negative. The Company is in its 26th year in run-off and as noted in prior statements, it is challenged to manage cash flow to meet all of its claims payment obligations. Additionally, the Company's ultimate parent is no longer able to provide financial support and the Company does not have adequate surplus to meet the minimum level required by the Ohio Department of Insurance.

NOTE 22 Events Subsequent

On April 4, 2023, R&Q Insurance Holdings Ltd ("RQIH" or the "Company") announced that it was undertaking a strategic initiative to separate its legacy insurance business and its program management business ("Accredited"). This restructure was done effective June 23, 2023, with the Accredited business reporting to Randall & Quilter America Holding Inc. ("RQAH") and legacy insurance business reporting to Grafton US Holdings Inc. ("Grafton"). On October 20, 2023, RQIH entered into a conditional agreement with funds advised by Onex Partners ("Onex") to sell 100% of the equity interests in RQAH, which has been subsequently renamed Accredited Insurance Holdings, Inc. ("AIH"), the holding company of Accredited (the "Sale"). Shareholder approval was obtained on January 11, 2024. RQIH announced on June 19, 2024, that it would be filing for provisional liquidation in Bermuda. On June 21, 2024, RQIH filed, in the Bermuda Supreme Court, an application to appoint Joint Provisional Liquidators ("JPLs") to oversee the liquidation and a petition to take the initial steps to commence the winding up of the Company. On June 26, 2024, a hearing of the application for provisional liquidation took place at which Michael Morrison, Mark Allitt and Charles Thresh of Teneo (Bermuda) Limited were appointed as JPLs of RQIH. On June 27, 2024, the Company announced that the sale of 100% of its equity interest in AIH to Onex was completed, according to revised terms for the Sale (the "Alternative Proposal") which had been considered and approved by the Board of RQIH. The existence of the Alternative Proposal was disclosed in a regulatory news announcement on June 11, 2024. RQIH, through certain servicing company subsidiaries, agreed to provide certain transition services in connection with the Sale subject to terms of the Alternative Proposal.

Following the Sale, the Transport Board was told by the JPLs that the remaining obligation under the current MOU (effective December 15, 2023) with Ohio Department of Insurance ("ODI") would not be funded. On July 17, 2024, the Company met with the ODI and informed them of this funding decision. As a result, the permitted practice allowing the Company to discount Loss and LAE (excluding A&O/ULAE) reserves on a non-tabular basis at a rate of 4.25% on all lines of business is no longer in effect. The financial statements as of June 30, 2024, reflect the Company's reserves on an undiscounted basis.

Subsequent events have been considered through September 16, 2024 for these statutory financial statements which are to be issued on September 17, 2024. There were no events occurring subsequent to the end of the quarter that merited recognition or disclosure in these statements other than stated in this note.


