Management concluded that the remaining investments within the loaned backed securities portfolio held with unrealized losses were not other-than-temporarily impaired on the basis that the Company had the ability and intent to hold the investments for a period of time sufficient for a forecasted market price recovery up to or beyond the cost of the investment. Also, in management's opinion, evidence indicating the cost of the investment was recoverable within a reasonable period of time outweighed evidence to the contrary in considering the severity and duration of the impairment in relation to the forecasted market price recovery.

A. The Company's portion of pooled loss reserves as of December 31, 2023, was \$37.8 million. On a pooled basis as of September 30, 2024, \$13.2 million has been paid for incurred claims and claim adjustment expenses attributable to insured events of prior years. Pooled reserves remaining for prior years are now \$21.3 million. There has been a \$3.3 million favorable prior-year development, on a pooled basis, from December 31, 2023 to September 30, 2024 as a result of re-estimation of unpaid claims and claim adjustment expenses principally on private passenger auto physical damage, commercial multi-peril, commercial auto liability and homeowners lines of business. The decrease is generally the result of ongoing analysis of recent loss development trends. Original estimates are increased or decreased, as additional information becomes known regarding individual claims. The Company does not have any retrospectively rated policies which would be included in the favorable development.

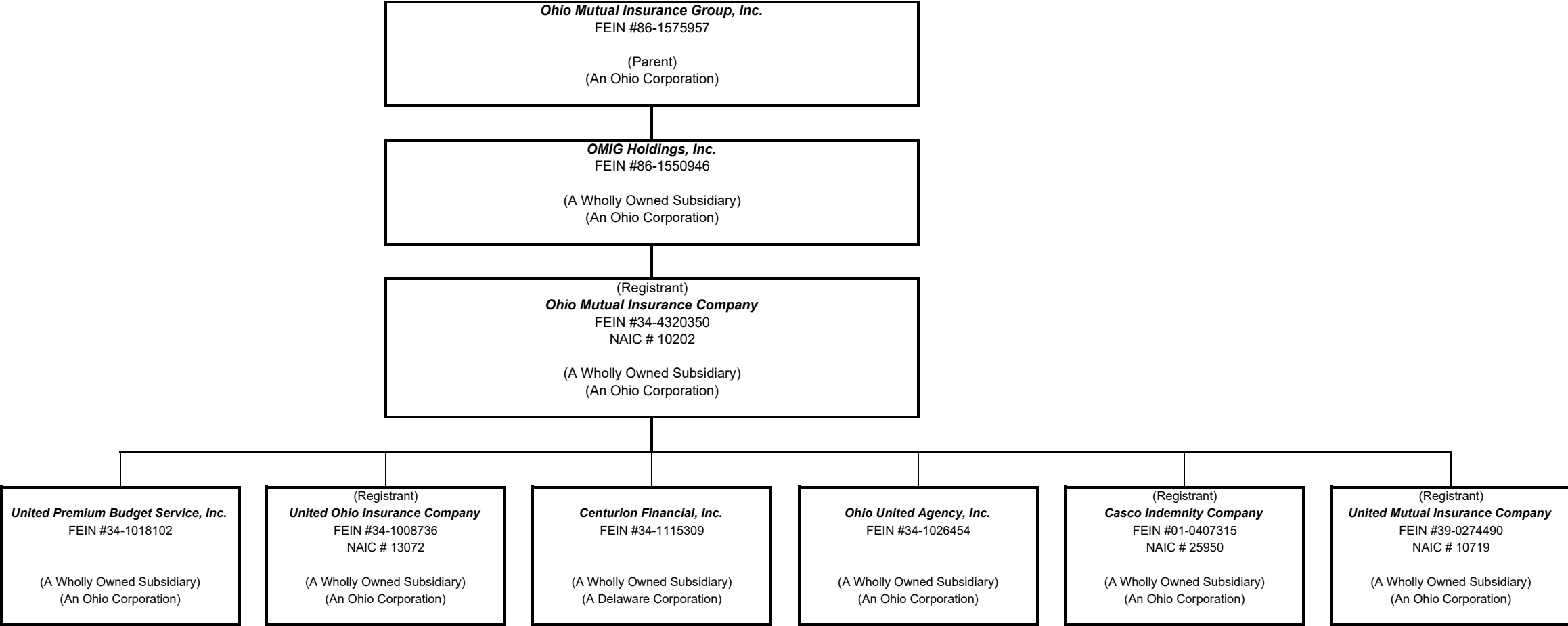

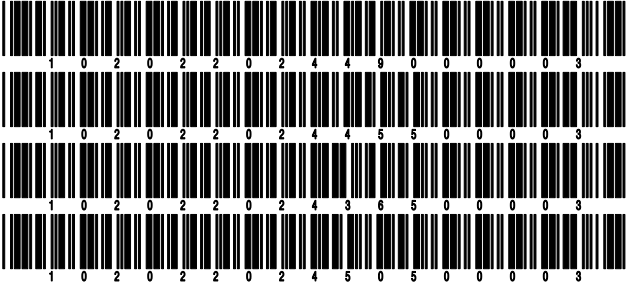
