Notes to the Financial Statements

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies and Going Concern

A. Accounting Practices

The statutory Financial statements of OhioHealthy Health Insuring Corporation have been prepared on the statutory basis of accounting, in accordance with the accounting practices adopted by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) codification project (Codification), as prescribed or permitted by the Ohio Department of Insurance (DOI). These practices differ in some respects from U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). For statutory purposes, certain assets are accorded no value and thus reduce statutory capital and surplus. Also, short term investments and bonds are recorded at amortized cost for statutory purposes which differ from GAAP whereby short-term investments and bonds may be recorded at fair value. The presentation of the direct method statutory statement of cash flows under Codification is different from what would be presented under GAAP for cash flows from investing and financing activities.

B. Use of Estimates in the Preparation of the Financial Statements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Statutory Accounting Principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities. D. Going Concern

Management has evaluated the Company's ability to continue and OHHIC will be surrendering their licenses and will be exiting from the small group ACA product. As of December 31, 2024 notice was given to the eleven(11) groups that March 31, 2025 will be the last date of available coverage. The groups were notified to secure alternative coverage. OhioHealthy will need to continue to process claims that will more than likely take one(1) year.

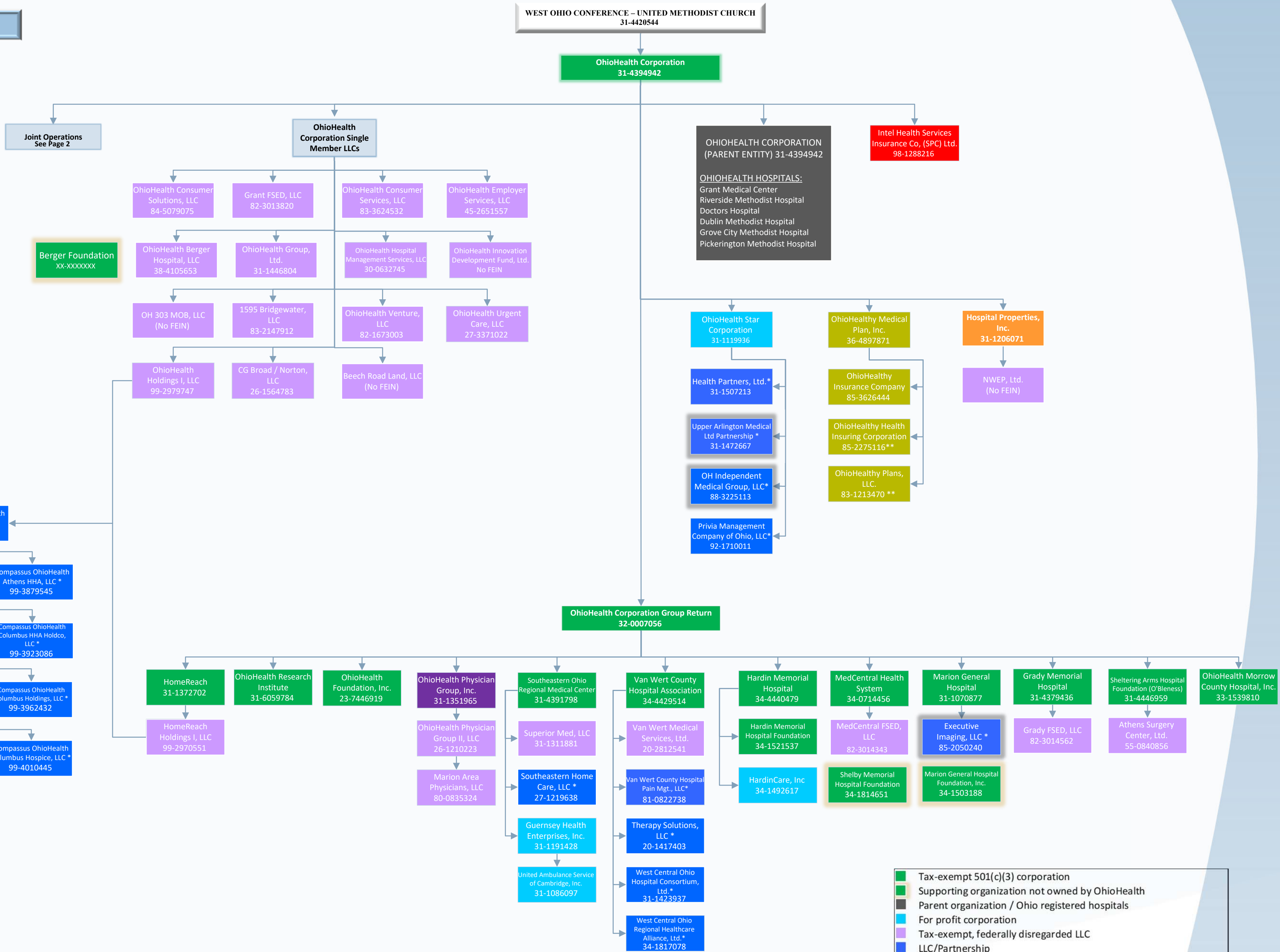
